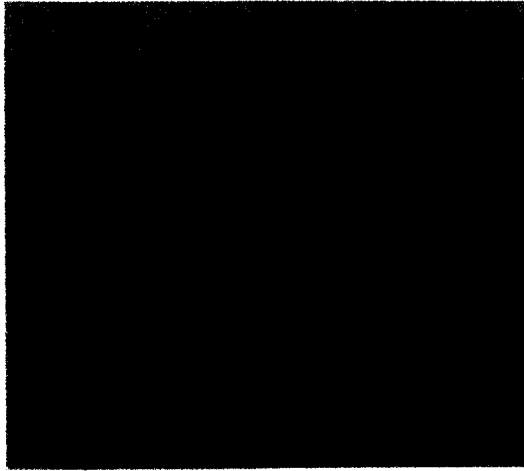

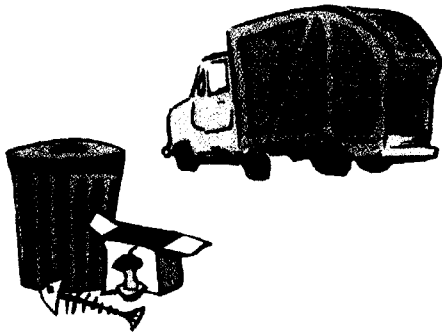

1 REFUSE COLLECTION

Refuse will be collected once per week from all residential units - single family, duplex and four family units or less. The city is divided into four sections with collections being on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays. The city contractor will collect all perishable waste, including:

- vegetable and fruit waste
- animal manure (securely wrapped or bagged)
- household wastes including ashes, metals, glass, paper, clothing
- non-corrugated boxes
- old appliances
- water heaters
- furniture and mattresses
- carpeting (cut in 4' lengths, rolled and tied)
- clean empty paint cans with lids removed

The contractor will not collect:

- lumber, building and remodeling materials, construction materials
- tires, automobile parts
- stones, rocks or dirt
- steel or iron
- motor oil
- pesticide containers
- paint, paint thinner or other paint products
- tree stumps
- dead animals



2 YARD WASTE

Yard waste includes grass clippings and leaves (bagged and not to exceed 40 pounds), tree limbs, wood, etc., as long as it is bundled up in lengths of less than four (4) feet and the diameter does not exceed two (2) feet and is securely tied. The yard waste is picked up with regular garbage. Please note, the City of Oregon promotes and supports mulching of grass clippings and leaves and encourages residents to compost their yard waste.



3 RECYCLABLE MATERIALS

The City of Oregon operates a curbside recycling program in conjunction with garbage collection. There is no limit on the amount of recyclables that you may put out each week. In addition, more than one bin can be purchased and set out in order to avoid overflowing.

A 1-4-gallon rectangular plastic recycling bin is available from the City of Oregon at a charge of \$6.00 for a new bin and \$3.00 for a replacement bin for use by residents. Please call us at 698-7016 at the Division of Streets or pick one up at 5330 Seaman Road in the Water Department.

The following materials are the only items that will be accepted in our curbside container recycling program:

- glass bottles and jars (clear, brown, green)
- beverage cans (all types)
- steel cans (no paint cans or flammable liquid cans of any kind)
- plastic soft drink bottles
- milk and water bottles
- liquid laundry detergent bottles
- bleach and fabric softener bottles
- newspaper and glossy inserts are acceptable.



This material can be either tied and bundled or put in brown grocery bags when placed at the curb. Do not commingle any other material in with this newspaper or it will be left at the curb in the recycling bin.

- cardboard. This includes regular boxes, cereal boxes (remove the bag from inside the box), shoe boxes or pizza boxes. All boxes must be broken down (flattened) and tied or bundled together.

These bundles must be no larger than 24" x 24". These should be tied or bundled.



We do not accept junk mail or office paper of any kind with our curbside recycling program.



4 CONTAINER LOCATION

All containers and approved materials must be placed at the curb or along the pavement (within 6 feet of the edge of the pavement), unless otherwise required, on the collection day and no earlier than 8:00 pm on the night before. Collections shall be made between the hours of 7:00 am and 7:00 pm.

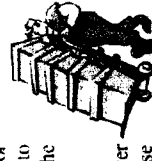
Where there is a ditch between the pavement and the dwelling, the containers shall be placed along the side of the driveway but on the dwelling side of the ditch.

The contractor shall place containers back on the curb, along the pavement with tops on containers. There shall be no banging of containers or throwing of containers into yards. The contractor shall clean up the spillage caused by his collectors. All misses must be picked up on the same day if possible.



5 DISABLED HOUSEHOLDER

Carry out and carry back service will be provided to residents who meet the city's requirements and are approved for this type of service. This service will be provided up to a maximum of four (4) containers. All containers in excess of four (4) shall be placed at the curb or street by the owner or resident. For more information or to request an application for this service, please contact the Streets Division at 698-7016.



Collectors will not enter garages of dwellings or enter enclosed premises when the gate is locked or if a dog is loose upon the premises for disabled residents' refuse.



6 SPECIAL SERVICE

Residents desiring special service beyond the contract requirements may negotiate privately with the contractor of such special service.



7 MATERIALS NOT CONSIDERED REFUSE AND RUBBISH

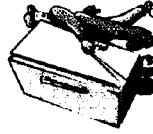
The contractor shall not be required to collect and dispose of any abandoned, condemned or rejected product, by-product, manufactured waste material or stock of any wholesale dealer, for example, eggs, fish, meat, pickles, fruit or vegetables, and which shall be regarded as trade waste, but all of the same and similar items shall be removed and disposed of by the owners thereof, and at such owner's expense.

All industrial by-products, commercial waste, building materials, tree stumps, and dead animals shall be removed and disposed of by the resident, owner or householder at his expense.



8 LARGE ITEM PICK-UP

Large items such as furniture, appliances, mattresses, carpet, etc. will be collected on the same day as your rubbish. Place at the curb with your rubbish before 7:00 am or the night before.



No telephone call is needed for large item collection. Simply place the item at the curb on your regular collection day. Please remove any doors from items before placing at the curb (for the safety of children playing nearby). Bundle any carpet in lengths of 4 feet or less and no more than 40 pounds in weight.



9 ITEMS WITH FREON

Refrigerator, freezer, air conditioner and dehumidifier units contain Freon. These items are picked up on the first Wednesday of each month. You must contact Waste Management at 666-5507 at least 24 hours in advance to schedule a pick-up.



PICK UP SCHEDULE

Your pick-ups will generally fall around the same time each week. However, due to traffic, road conditions and volumes, the pick-up time may vary. To insure pick-up, please have your rubbish at the curb before 7:00 am or the night before your collection day.



Place rubbish in cans with lids and handles no larger than 30 gallons and weighing no more than 60 pounds at curb side. Plastic bags can also be used but must not exceed 40 pounds in weight.



WHAT IF I HAVE BEEN MISSED?

Check the following:

- Was it too heavy?
- Was it properly bundled?
- Was the can larger than 30 gallons?
- Was the rubbish set out at 7:00 am or the night before?
- Was the rubbish set at the curb?

If everything was OK, call the Streets Division at 698-7016.

EnviroScape® Nonpoint Source Model

Water pollution comes from many sources. Nonpoint sources contribute a great deal to the pollution in our water bodies. The combined affect of pollution from many small sources can have a real impact on the quality of our shared water resources.

EnviroScape® Nonpoint Source tracks pollution from nonpoint sources, including residential areas, forestry, transportation, recreation, agriculture and construction, as well as from industry as a point source. Pollution and runoff are visually apparent when rain falling over the landscape top carries soil (cocoa), chemicals (colored drink mixes) and oil (cocoa and water mixture) through a watershed to a body of water. Best management practices include felt buffer strips as vegetation, clay to create berms and other methods to show conservation and water pollution prevention measures at work.

In addition to a comprehensive User's Guide, the Nonpoint Source model includes the *Handle With Care* book published by the Terrene Institute.

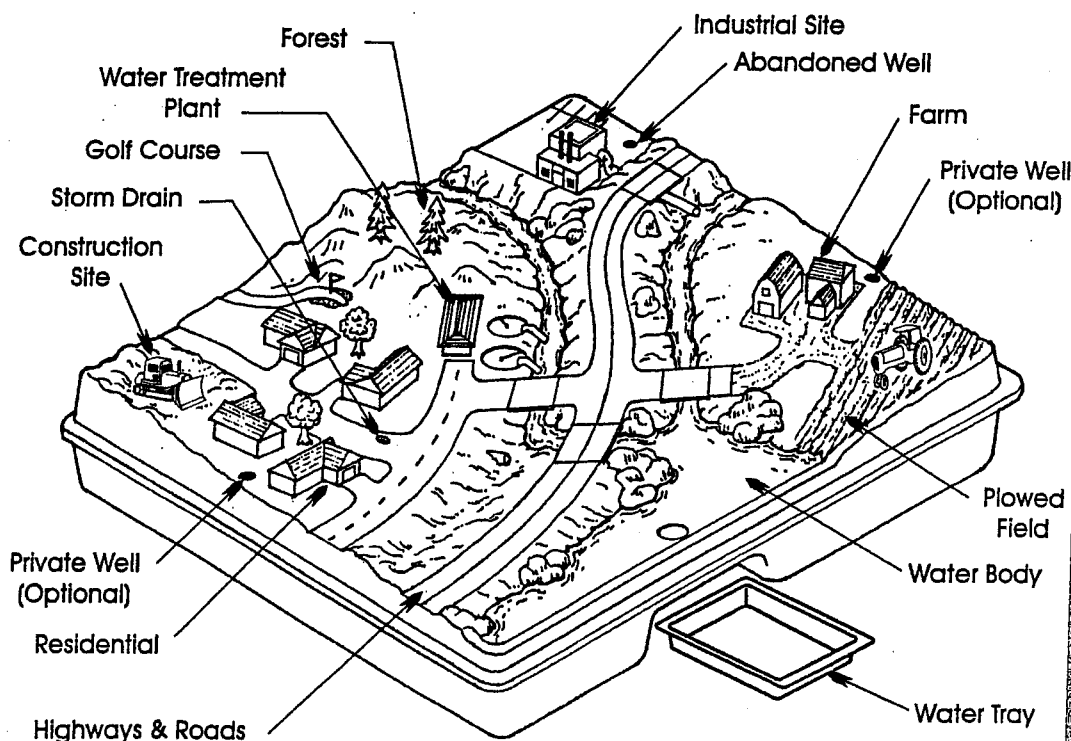
